Architecture for Security by Design of Places of Worship - Call for Best Practice Examples



The call for best practice architectural examples is meant as a vehicle to promote and advance the expertise of European architects in Security by Design of public spaces and in particular religious buildings in their urban context. It is also a way to enhance the ACE policy positions, for example, on the quality of architecture and urban spaces for cultural and social use.


The call for best practice examples of religious architecture as part of public space in Europe invites entries of new buildings and ensembles, as well as conservation, restoration, and interventions on existing structures. Works must have been completed under the oversight of a qualified architectural team. The submitted projects will be assessed by the professional jury appointed within the SOAR programme.

The selected projects will be exhibited and featured in a booklet of 'Best Practice Examples' and on the SOAR project website. Additionally, they will assist in developing design guidelines to improve security of religious sites.

Architectural practices of any size are welcome to join and submit their best built project (one project per firm maximum). The projects can be places of worship of any faith (synagogue, church, mosque, temple etc.), which demonstrate the application of SBD concepts and can be either new constructions or renovations. The buildings must be completed and should be located in Europe, in any country which is eligible for participation within the EU funding scheme for the SOAR programme.





International Day of Commemoration in memory of the victims of the Holocaust

27 January marks the International Day of Commemoration in memory of the victims of the Holocaust. "This day was chosen by the United Nations General Assembly to mark the liberation of the Auschwitz Birkenau German Nazi Concentration and Extermination Camp (1940-1945)."

We would like to recall the EU Strategy on combating antisemitism and fostering Jewish life (2021-2030). SOAR stands against antisemitism, discrimination, racism, and other forms of intolerance. On 27 January we remember and pay tribute to victims of the Holocaust.





The Central Council of Muslims Calls for Securing Mosques in Germany

As a response to the rise of attacks on mosques and Islamic institutions, the Central Council of Muslims in Germany called on the administrations of Islamic institutions and mosques to appoint Security and Safety Commissioners to increase the security of religious sites.

The Council aims to train the newly appointed Security and Safety Commissioners in coordination with the SOAR project.

The training will be focused on diverse aspects of security for places of worship and will address the principle of Security by Design and its implementation.

Remembering David Sassoli, the European Parliament President

We are saddened to hear about the passing of David Sassoli, the European Parliament President and Italian social democrat.

Prior to his political career, David Sassoli was a successful TV news presenter. During his presidency, he was able to direct the European Parliament during the extraordinarily difficult times of the pandemic.

We join members of the European Commission and EU Council in offering condolences to his colleagues, friends, and family.





Anniversary of Charlie Hebdo shooting and Hypercacher kosher supermarket siege

7th of January marks the Anniversary of the Charlie Hebdo shooting in Paris. Two armed brothers, entered the offices of the controversial newspaper, killed 12 people and injured 11.

9th of January marks the Anniversary of the Hypercacher kosher supermarket siege in East Paris, 2 days after the Charlie Hebdo incident. An armed man killed 4 people and took several hostages.


Our thoughts go to all victims of terrorism, all those affected by acts of terror, and we stand in solidarity with all victims and survivors.

France: 4 million Euros to Better Secure Places of Worship

Gérald Darmanin, France's Interior Minister, <u>announced</u> the plan to release 4 million Euros to better secure places of worship against crime. The resources will mainly be focussed to the finance of video protection and be primarily directed to the Catholic Church.

The fund will be made available through the <u>Interministerial</u> <u>Fund for the Prevention of Delinquency and Radicalization.</u>
Under this Fund religious associations that manage sensitive sites may apply for enhancing the physical protection of places of worship.





UNAOC Press Statement on the Attacks on Religious Sites that Took Place in 2021



The High Representative for the United Nations Alliance of Civilizations, Mr. Miguel Ángel Moratinos, strongly condemns the attacks on religious sites that took place in 2021.


According to the Press Statement released on 19th of January 2022, Mr. Miguel Ángel Moratinos "recalls the UN Plan of Action to Safeguard Religious Sites, [...], and calls on all governments and relevant stakeholders to support the implementation of the Plan to guarantee the safety of holy sites and worshipers."






