On the 13 of May 2022, the Jewish Community Vienna published the Antisemitism Report for 2021. The Community recorded a total of 965 anti-Semitic incidents in 2021.

It is reported that there has been an increase of 65% of incidents. It is the highest number recorded by the community since recording began 20 years ago.

CIDI: ONLINE ANTISEMITISM RESEARCH

On the 24th of May 2022, the Israel Information and Documentation Center and Central Jewish Council published a research paper relating to 2020 Online Antisemitism.

On behalf of CIDI and CJO the Utrecht Data School of Utrecht University counted over 200,000 anti-Semitic messages online in Dutch.

On 24th of May 2022, the #brandeilig initiative published their report into 2018 mosques attacks in Germany. The publication reviewed 120 incidents against mosques that took place in 2018. The report concludes that "[a]fter an attack, mosque communities are largely on their own, the detection rate is very low, insurance companies rarely pay and expressions of solidarity are often only heard from other Muslim communities."


