# REGIONAL / NATIONAL ENGAGEMENT & DISCUSSION







# THE OSCE PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY'S 29TH ANNUAL SESSION



**WHEN: 02-06 JULY** 

WHERE: BIRMINGHAM, UK

During the OSCE Parliamentary Assembly's 29th Annual Session in Birmingham, UK, the assembly adopted the Birmingham declaration. The declaration also includes the Resolution on Victims of Terrorism. Thus, the resolution "[c]alls on participating States to decisively address domestic terrorism targeted at groups based on ethnicity, race, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, religion, political affiliation or citizenship status [...]"



# URBAN ENVIRONMENT SECURITY THREAT OR OPPORTUNITY FOR PREVENTION?







## UNAOCO Iniversity Nations Alliance of Civilizations




The UNAOC and UNOSAT launched an interactive map of Religious sites in Sweden. The map includes 4,438 religious sites representing 13 denominations.


The map was released as part of the recommendations of the United Nations Plan of Action to Safeguard Religious Sites developed by UNAOC in 2019. The colour-coded map provides a number of option to navigate the provided information.

# MANUAL ON PREVENTION OF AND RESPONSES TO TERRORIST ATTACKS



The United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime published the Manual on Prevention of and Responses to Terrorist Attacks on the basis of Xenophobia, Racism and other Forms of Intolerance or in the Name of Religion of Belief. The document provides an overview of the threat posed by terrorist attacks committed on the basis xenophobia, racism and other forms of intolerance, or in the name of religion or belief, it looks at legal and administrative and provides responses, а set recommendations





# EUROPEAN UNION TERRORISM SITUATION AND TREND REPORT 2022



Europol published the anual European Union Terrorism Situation and Trend Report 2022.

The report states that there were "15 completed, foiled and failed attacks in 2021 in the EU" which represents a decrease from 2020 and 2019. Similarly, there were 388 terrorism-related offences arrests in 2021. This represents a decrease from 2020 (449), and 2019 (723). The most arrests (5) and attacks (140) were registered in France.

# NEW HATE CRIME LEGISLATION



**WHERE: IRELAND** 

On the 13th of July 2022 the Irish The Minister for Justice, Helen McEntee, announced a new Hate Crime legislation. The new legislation aims to make it "easier to secure prosecutions and convictions".


The legislation is victim oriented and tries to secure more effective prosecutions and convictions by employing a "demonstration test". The demonstration test "means simply that a perpetrator demonstrates hatred towards a member of a protected group/characteristic at the time of an offence being committed."

# ANNUAL REPORT - HATE CRIME 2021

WHERE: AUSTRIA



The Austrian Federal Ministry of the Interior published the anual Hate Crime Report 2021.

According to the report, 5,464 biasmotivated crimes and 6,619 prejudice motives crimes were recorded in 2021. 2.052 crimes were recorded under the belief, followed category of bγ national/ethnic origin (1,874), religion (750), skin color (408), sexual orientation (376), gender (354), social status (287), age (266) and disability (252).


