SOAR stands for 'Strengthening the security and resilience of at-risk religious sites and communities' programme. We, Enhancing Faith Institutions (EFI) are the lead partner of this EU-funded project and we are working alongside our European project partners Finn Church Aid and Architects' Council of Europe. The project is supported by the United Nations Alliance of Civilisations.

A key component of the programme is to advance the protection of religious sites by implementing a 'security by design' (SBD) concept. Providing time for experts in our trainings to discuss this concept and its importance, makes it a key aspect of the SOAR programme.

Editorial Note

Places of Worship have long been vulnerable targets for terrorism, hate crime, extremism, and vandalism. Attacks on places of worship is not a new phenomenon. Rather it is an increasingly worrying trend that puts our societies at risk. An attack against a place of worship is an attack against a community, against our fundamental freedom of religion or belief. The freedom of thought, conscience and religion are protected by international legal instruments, such as the UN, as well as national legal frameworks.
